Policy statement on the Safeguarding of Adults & Children in the Church

This statement was adopted by Bunbury PCC at a Parochial Church Council meeting on 19th May 2015 of which a signed copy is held on record. The statement is reviewed and affirmed annually by our PCC.



- We recognise that everyone has different levels of vulnerability and that each of us may be regarded as vulnerable at some time in our lives.
- 2.As members of this parish we commit ourselves to respectful pastoral care for all children and adults to whom we minister.
- 3. We commit ourselves to the safeguarding of people who may be vulnerable, ensuring their well-being in the life of this church.
- 4. We commit ourselves to promoting safe practice by those in positions of trust.
- 5. The parish commits itself to promoting inclusion and empowerment of people who may be vulnerable.
- 6. It is the responsibility of each of us to prevent the physical, emotional, sexual, financial and spiritual abuse of vulnerable people and to report any such abuse that we discover or suspect.
- 7. We undertake to exercise proper care in the appointment and selection of those who will work with people who may be vulnerable.
- The parish is committed to supporting, resourcing, training and regularly reviewing those who undertake work amongst people who may be vulnerable.
- 9. The parish adopts the policies/guidelines of the House of Bishops and the Diocese
- 10. Each person who works with vulnerable people will agree to abide by these recommendations and the guidelines established by this church.

Safeguarding our Community

Concern/Allegation

You suspect or witness abuse, or someone else discloses information about a safeguarding concern or allegation

Emergency - immediate

If a child or adult is in immediate danger and requires medical attention, call the police and/or social services immediately on 999

Record and report all the information to the incumbent (vicar) and Parish Safeguarding Officer (PSO)

Non emergency - within 24 hours

Record and report to the incumbent (vicar) /PSO or activity leader. Agree who will inform the Diocesan Safeguarding Adviser (DSA).

Record and discuss with the DSA within 24 hours

The DSA will provide advice and guidance
